BUDGET: BPAB is staffed by Gainesville (City) Public Works, providing administrative support, orientations, meeting/project coordination, etc. City Public Works entered into agreement with Alachua County and MTPCO to provide services and operate the group. Funds are provided annually to address BPAB projects and operation. BPAB also considers other funding opportunities such as grants to supplement projects.

CONTACT US: BPAB is advisory to three agencies where each agency appoints four regular members (Gainesville City Commission also appoints a student seat to a 2-year term). Appointment to BPAB is handled through each agency's regular advisory board process.

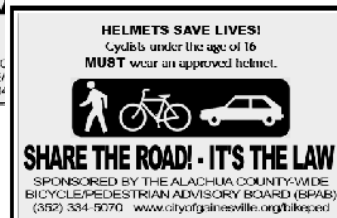
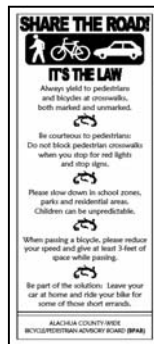
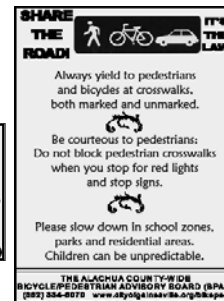

The main function of the B.P.A.B. is to meet regularly to provide advisory information to the Gainesville & Alachua County Commission bodies, as well as the M.T.P.O. agency. Meetings are held about every two months from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. in the 2nd Floor - Grace Knight Conference Room at the Alachua County Administration Building in downtown Gainesville (12 S.E. 1st Street, Gainesville, Florida. 32601). Meeting packets are mailed and made available online a week prior to the meeting. Contact BPAB staff or visit the website for meeting information questions/concerns.
